


Course Director





Chor Leong is a lawyer of more than 39 years' standing. In private legal practice, he specialized in commercial and corporate litigation, arbitration and dispute resolution. His main areas of expertise are in contract and construction law. He has acted as counsel and arbitrator in numerous arbitrations under the rules of the Singapore International Arbitration Centre, International Chamber of Commerce, Singapore Institute of Architects, Singapore Institute of Arbitrators and other *ad hoc* arbitrations. He currently

practises mostly as arbitrator, adjudicator and mediator.

Chor Leong is a Fellow of the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators and serves on its Council. He was the Course Director of the 2018 and 2019 editions of the International Entry Course and the Deputy Course Director of the 2018 and 2019 editions of the Fellowship Assessment Course, both conducted by the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators, and he has lectured in those courses.

Delphine started practice in one of the largest legal firms in Singapore, handling a broad spectrum of international commercial disputes, including construction and infrastructure projects, shareholder and joint venture disputes, energy, transportation and technology. She entered the Singapore judicial service in 2013, serving concurrently as an Assistant Registrar in the Supreme Court and District Judge of the State Courts.
