About the Seminar:

Arbitrators today face a unique set of challenges in the face of increasing sophistication of business practices globally. The need for life-long learning has never been more important amid the diversity of business practices, business trends and industry practices. To meet the demands of change brought about by globalisation, there is a growing trend of compulsory Continuing Professional Development (CPD) implementation in many professions in Singapore and elsewhere in the region. The Singapore Institute of Arbitrators has taken an important step to introduce compulsory CPD for its panel arbitrators with effect from January 2009 in its bid to maintain and enhance the performance standards of its panel arbitrators. This seminar will explain the rationale and detailed working of the Institute's compulsory CPD program and prepare arbitrators for the implementation in 2009. This seminar will also assist parties involved in arbitration appreciate the mechanics regulating the professional competence of panel arbitrators of the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators and the Singapore International Arbitration Centre. In the Institute's quest to gear its members to broaden their knowledge base in arbitration practice under dynamic, evolving market conditions in their areas of specialisation, compulsory CPD implementation is timely and purposeful. The framework workings, benefits and guidelines compliance in today's fast-paced work environment will also be discussed at this seminar.

Justice V K Rajah graduated from the National University of Singapore in 1982 with several prizes for academic merit. He subsequently obtained an LLM (First Class) from University of Cambridge in 1986. He was appointed a Judicial Commissioner of the Supreme Court, Singapore on 2 January 2004 and thereafter a Judge on 1 November 2004. Justice Rajah was appointed a Judge of Appeal on 11 April 2007. He recently chaired a government appointed committee tasked with making recommendations to develop the Singapore Legal Sector.

In addition to an active practice, Mohan also teaches in his capacity as Adjunct Associate Professor at the Faculty of Law, National University of Singapore and Visiting Professor at the Centre of Construction Law, King's College London, University of London. He is currently Chairman of the Society of Construction Law (Singapore) and Chair of the International Construction Projects Committee, Inter-Pacific Bar Association.
